

Trail Hunt

White Ash- Bark is gray with diamond-shaped ridges. It has many oval leaflets. Leaves are dark green with whitish bottom.



These are the names of trees that can be found in the Adirondacks and some clues to help you identify them. While walking on the nature trail, look for each tree and when you see one, put a check mark in the box.

Red Pine- Bark is red-brown with thick, scaly plates. Needles are dark green, cluster of two. Cones are oval.

Beech- Bark is gray, smooth with blotches. Leaves are long, narrow, pointed and tooth. Yellow-green flowers hang in clusters.

Paper Birch- Bark is white and peeling with dark lining running around the trunk. Leaves are long, pointed, dull green ovals with teeth. Flowers are catkins that grow to small cones.



White Oak- Bark is light gray with ridges. Large leaves are green.



Red Maple Tree- Bark is gray and furrowed, growing scaly with age. Leaves are five inches wide, tooth and lobed with reddish stem.
